He recommended 30 minutes a day of walking and to record your distance covered. It is important to know your intensity for the most benefit.

Five times a year, you can claim a visit to the Exercise Physiologist from Medicare if referred by a GP for exercise based advice.

Aqua Aerobics is also a good alternative.

## Rotary Information with PDG Fred Marsh.

### February is World Understanding Month.

One of District 9455's most successful Community and International Service programs has been the Used Postage Stamp Project.

+ This project had its genesis in Nepal, where there was a need to immunise villagers against tuberculosis. Through our contact with District 2570 in Saitama Japan in early 1976



through the Australia Japan Rotaract Exchange, we joined in to support the Japanese Overseas Christian Services to purchase anti TB vaccine for teams of Japanese Doctors in Nepal.

+ In the first year, 300,000 stamps were contributed. Our shipments grew rapidly to reach 10 million in the 6<sup>th</sup> year. By 1987 TB was eradicated in Nepal and our used stamps were then directed to support hospital funding in India and Bangladesh. Also our first shipment to OXFAM in London commenced at one tonne per year to fund humanitarian projects in Africa [\$25,000 annually]

+ The total value of stamps delivered overseas now exceeds more than \$600,000 over a period of 35 years. In addition \$7000 raised from wastepaper

+ Occupational Therapists applauded the program for its therapeutic value to residents of aged homes, who trim the stamps. It creates social benefits and a stimulating experience for hundreds of participants.

+ The District Committee requires an additional 10,000 stamps per month. This is a sort of challenge Scarborough Rotarians can handle. It behoves all of us to recruit one extra non-Rotarian business, shop or company to collect stamps for you each month to help with the shortfall.

The meeting will be mainly social, with partners, with a tour of the factory. This will probably last about 45 minutes. There will be **NO COST** for this part of the day.

We are then adjourning to Paul Conti's, again with partners - the open area behind the Restaurant, from 12.00 noon for a BBQ.

**When I got names and numbers this morning I was assuming that those of you who said YES were coming to BOTH PARTS of the event.**

Because many people are coming from the Country, we decided that we would provide tables, chairs, crockery, cutlery, glasses, BBQ's & Gas etc etc. We are also providing BBQ packs, rolls and Salads.

The cost for all of this will be \$ 25.00 per head. As our numbers are looking to be more than I expected, I suspect that the actual cost will be closer to \$ 20 - \$ 22 per head. I intend, if this is the case, to use any excess money to buy some wine from Conti's to put on the tables.

As I am going to be collecting money before the event I will know who will need BBQ packs etc, and will hand these out accordingly on the day. **IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO BRING YOUR OWN FOOD AND CUTLERY ETC - WE CAN ACCOMODATE THAT. There would then be a small charge - about \$ 5 - to cover the tables, Chairs & BBQ's.**

I am doing this because I would like as many people to both parts of the event as possible - to make a really good social day out of it.

I will approach everyone again at Rotary over the next 2 weeks to sort out what everyone would like to do.

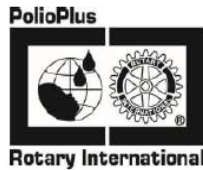
